About the Course

The HLT33115 - Certificate III in Health Services Assistance covers workers in a range of work roles who provide assistance to health professional staff with the care of clients. Health Services Assistance work in direct client contact but under supervision.

The curriculum for this qualification has been structured with elective groups for specific work functions in assisting in nursing work in acute care. Additionally, the qualification supports the multi-skilling requirements of smaller and rural or remote work settings.

This qualification is suited to Australian Apprenticeship pathways.

The course is provided through Face to Face mode of delivery. It will be delivered over 714 hours including 352 hours of theory and tutorials, 120 hours of simulation-based training and assessment, 60 hours of structured interactive learning (SIL), and 80 hours of Professional Experience Placement (PEP).

This course follows Competency-based training which is the concept that individuals learn at different rates as well as through different modes and different environments and that the skills and knowledge that a student has acquired previously are able to be formally recognised.

Mode of Delivery

Face to Face

20 contact hours per week will be delivered through synchronised face to face learning which includes oncampus sessions and simulation training/assessment.

The course includes 80 hours of Professional Experience Placement (PEP).

Students must meet additional requirements for Professional Experience Placements as required such as a clear police check, working with children check & immunisations.

Entry Requirements

- Successful completion of Australian Year 10 or equivalent.
- Must be 18 years or older at the start of the course[^]
- Pass the Language, Literacy, and Numeracy (LLN) test at ACSF level 3.
- English proficiency requirements:
 - » IELTS (Academic) 6.0 overall or equivalent*

Additional Requirements

 Should possess basic computer skills covering the most common usages of a computer, including managing computer files, word processing, using spreadsheets and databases; creating presentations; finding information and communicating using computers; and being aware of social and ethical implications of Internet use.

Professional Experience Placement (PEP) requirements

- Satisfactory National Police Clearance (NCC) or Australian Federal Police (AFP) Clearance certificate.
- Required immunisations.
- · Working with Children Check (WWCC).
- Valid NDIS Worker Screening Check.

Physical Requirements:

- » Strength: To assist with lifting and transferring a client, and perform CPR
- » Mobility: To bend, stoop, move quickly, and navigate confined spaces.
- » Hearing: To use a stethoscope, hear cries for help, equipment alarms, emergency signals, and announcements.
- » Vision: To assess clients and equipment.
- » Communication: To interact verbally and in writing with clients, staff, and supervisors.

(Note: Students must declare a disability or disorder (if any), or if they are on any medication which may require reasonable adjustments)

Where a student breaches the above requirements, they could be excluded from their practical placements which may result in unsuccessful completion of the course.
