

CHC33021 – Certificate III in Individual Support (Ageing, Disability)

About the Course

This qualification is designed for workers in the community or residential setting who provide individualised support to the aged or people with disabilities. They must use discretion and judgement, and take responsibility for their own outputs. They are taught factual, technical and procedural knowledge of the concepts and practices required.

Students may undertake this course as an entry pathway into the aged care or disability care industry. Our course is directed towards developing multi-skilled workers for the broad range of services supporting aged people and the disabled in residential and community settings.

The course is provided through Face to Face mode of delivery. It will be delivered over 945 hours including 442 hours of lectures and tutorials, 116 hours of simulation based training and assessment, 94 hours of structured interactive learning (SIL), and 120 hours of Professional Experience Placement (PEP).

This course follows Competency-based training which is the concept that individuals learn at different rates as well as through different modes and different environments and that the skills and knowledge that a student has acquired previously are able to be formally recognised.

Mode of Delivery

Face to Face

20 contact hours per week will be delivered through synchronised face to face learning which includes on-campus sessions and simulation training/assessment.

Besides the above structured learning, students are advised that they will be required to do approximate 15 hours of study time their own pace per unit of competency.

The course includes 120 hours of Professional Experience Placement (PEP).

Students must meet additional requirements for Professional Experience Placements as required such as a clear police check, working with children check & immunisations.

Entry Requirements

- Successful completion of Australian Year 10 or equivalent.
- Must be 18 years or older at the start of the course.
- Pass the Language, Literacy, and Numeracy (LLN) test at ACSF level 3.
- English proficiency requirements:
 - » IELTS (Academic) 6.0 overall or equivalent

Additional Requirements

Should possess basic computer skills covering the most common usages of a computer, including managing computer files, word processing, using spreadsheets and databases; creating presentations; finding information and communicating using computers; and being aware of social and ethical implications of Internet use.

Professional Experience Placement (PEP) requirements

- Satisfactory National Police Clearance (NCC) or Australian Federal Police (AFP) Clearance certificate.
- Required immunisations.
- Working with Children Check (WWCC).
- Valid NDIS Worker Screening Check.

Physical Requirements:

- » Strength: To assist with lifting and transferring a client, and perform CPR
- » Mobility: To bend, stoop, move quickly, and navigate confined spaces.
- » Hearing: To use a stethoscope, hear cries for help, equipment alarms, emergency signals, and announcements.
- » Vision: To assess clients and equipment.
- » **Communication:** To interact verbally and in writing with clients, staff, and supervisors.

(Note: Students must declare a disability or disorder (if any), or if they are on any medication which may require reasonable adjustments)

Where a student breaches the above requirements, they could be excluded from their practical placements which may result in unsuccessful completion of the course.
