

HLT37015 - Certificate III in Sterilisation Services

About the Course

The HLT37015 - Certificate III in Sterilisation Services provides an essential support service, assisting medical and nursing staff in providing surgical and clinical care to patients. Sterilisation is an integral process where consultation, surgery, and invasive procedures are required.

This qualification is primarily designed to provide a range of varied activities required by employed and responsible workers for the sterilisation of equipment and compliance with infection control policies and procedures.

Course Details



Duration: 26 weeks (Full Time)



Training Hours: 550 Hours



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Course Delivery: Blended

The course is provided through Blended mode of delivery. It will be delivered over 550 hours including theory, self-paced structured e-learning, simulation training, and 80 hours of Professional Experience Placement (PEP).

This course follows Competency-based training which is the concept that individuals learn at different rates as well as through different modes and different environments and that the skills and knowledge that a student has acquired previously are able to be formally recognised.



Mode of Delivery

Blended Delivery

(Blended: Online real-time theory tutorials with on-campus skills training in a simulation environment)

Students must attend 20 hours of classes per week. This includes simulation-based assessments and professional experience placements.

20 contact hours per week will be delivered through synchronised online learning, which includes on-campus simulation-based training and professional experience placements.

In addition to structured learning, students should plan for approximately 10 hours per week of unstructured learning.

Students must meet additional requirements for professional experience placements (PEP), such as obtaining a clear police check, working with children check, and necessary immunisations.

Simulation-based assessment (1 to 2 weeks on campus) and Professional Placement (80 hours, approximately 3 to 4 weeks) are mandatory.

Entry Requirements

There are no mandatory entry requirements for this course; however, following IHNA admission criteria will be applicable:

- Applicants are required to be 18 years old and above.
- Successful completion of an ACSF test with demonstrated competence as per IHNA LLN requirements (issued within the last 12 months from the time of admission).
- It is also essential for students to possess basic computer skills.

Additional requirements for Professional Experience Placement:

- A satisfactory National Police Clearance / Australian Federal Police Clearance Certificate (AFP) / NCC will be required for all practical placements.
- Working with children check.

IHNA highly recommends students to complete the immunisation process before the Professional Experience Placement start date as some facilities will not provide placement to student without Immunisation.

Where a student breaches the above requirements, they could be excluded from their practical placements which may result in unsuccessful completion of the course.
